

6338. Dormeyer Air Purifier. (F.D.C. No. 44234. S. No. 75-365 P.)

QUANTITY: 8,273 individually ctn'd. devices at Chicago, Ill., in possession of Dormeyer Corp.

SHIPPED: 11-11-59 and 12-14-59, from New York, N.Y., by Darmon Tool & Mfg. Corp.

LABEL IN PART: (Ctn.) "Dormeyer Air Purifier Model No. AP-1 Dormeyer Corporation—Chicago 10, Illinois" and (device) "Dormeyer Air Purifier."

ACCOMPANYING LABELING: Booklet entitled "At Last! * * *"; sales promotion kits in a folder headed "A Special Merchandising Program for You"; and leaflets entitled "Caution," "At Last * * *," "Relief from sinus, allergies, air pollution," "Dormeyer Model AP-1 Air Purifier," "Sinus, allergies, air pollution," "Promotional fact and merchandising sheet to aid retail sales personnel in understanding the product," and "New Dormeyer Air Purifier."

LIBELED: 2-11-60, N. Dist. Ill.

CHARGE: 502(a)—when shipped and while held for sale, the labeling of the article contained false and misleading representations that the article was an adequate and effective treatment for relieving sinus, allergies, hay fever, asthma, and respiratory discomforts; killing germs and bacteria; improving health; and that use of the article would overcome health problems associated with air pollution.

DISPOSITION: 7-28-60. Consent—claimed by Dormeyer Corp., and relabeled.

6339. Refresh-Aire (electronic air purifier device). (F.D.C. No. 44181. S. No. 90-516 P.)

QUANTITY: 61 devices in possession of Gilchrist Co., at its Boston warehouse and at its stores at Boston, Medford, Quincy, Waltham, Brockton, and Framingham, Mass.

SHIPPED: 10-20-59 and 12-10-59, from New York, N.Y., by Refresher Industries, Inc.

LABEL IN PART: (Device) "Refresh-Aire * * * Refresher Industries, Inc., New York."

ACCOMPANYING LABELING: Placard entitled "Refresh-Aire Electronic Air Purifier" and a leaflet entitled "As Fresh As a Spring Breeze."

RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION: The above-mentioned placard was prepared by the dealer. The article was a portable, box-type cabinet containing an electric motor-driven fan which would cause room air to flow through an electrostatic field set up between a series of particle collection plates.

LIBELED: 1-14-60, Dist. Mass.

CHARGE: 502(a)—when shipped and while held for sale, the labeling which accompanied the article contained false and misleading representations that the article was an adequate and effective treatment for relieving hay fever, asthma and other allergies, and sinus conditions; and that it prevented infection from "sick room germs."

DISPOSITION: 5-23-60. Consent—claimed by Gilchrist Co. and relabeled.

DRUG FOR VETERINARY USE ***6340. Dr. Mayfield Liquid Roundwormer.** (F.D.C. No. 42030. S. No. 56-822 M.)

INFORMATION FILED: 11-25-58, N. Dist. Iowa, against Dr. Mayfield Laboratories, Inc., Charles City, Iowa, and Orley J. Mayfield, president.

SHIPPED: Between 10-31-56 and 2-27-57, from Charles City, Iowa to Mabel, Minn.

LABEL IN PART: "DR. MAYFIELD LIQUID ROUNDWORMER Net Contents 16 Fluid Ozs. [or other volume] For removal of Large Roundworms (*Ascaridia*) Cecal Worms (*Heterakis*) from Chickens.* * * Active Ingredients Piperazine Hexahydrate 38% Inert Ingredients: Water 62% Manufactured For DR. MAYFIELD LABORATORIES Charles City, Iowa."

CHARGE: 502(a)—when shipped, the label statement "For removal of * * * Cecal Worms (*Heterakis*) from Chickens" was false and misleading as applied to an article that was not effective for the removal of cecal worms from chickens.

PLEA: Not guilty.

DISPOSITION: On 5-5-60, the case came on to trial before the court and a jury, and on 5-7-60, the jury was excused because it could not reach a verdict. Thereafter, the case was dismissed.

DRUGS AND DEVICES

The cases reported herewith were instituted in the United States district courts by United States attorneys, acting upon reports submitted by the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare. They involve drugs which are required at time of interstate shipment to bear a label containing the statement "Caution: Federal law prohibits dispensing without prescription," and which were dispensed after such shipment without a prescription or by refilling a prescription without authorization. This dispensing was contrary to Section 503(b)(1), and thereby resulted in the dispensed drugs being misbranded while held for sale. Published by direction of the Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare.
